



MEMORANDUM OF
AGREEMENT BETWEEN
FACULTY OF SOCIAL AND POLITICAL
SCIENCES UNIVERSITAS DIPONEGORO
AND
RESEARCH CENTER FOR
CHINA-INDONESIA PEOPLE TO PEOPLE EXCHANGE
CENTRAL CHINA NORMAL UNIVERSITY



Faculty of Social and Political Sciences, Universitas Diponegoro (hereafter referred to as FISIP), located at Jl. dr. Antonius Suroyo, Universitas Diponegoro, Tembalang Campus, Semarang City, Central Java, Indonesia. Postal Code 50275, Research Center For China-Indonesia People to People Exchange, Central China Normal University located at 152 Luoyu Road, Hongshan District, Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China hereby agree to foster academic exchange and cooperation between the two institutions.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this agreement is to further mutual understanding between FISIP and Research Center For China-Indonesia People to People Exchange, Central China Normal University to enhance each institution's teaching, learning, and internationalization objectives. This collaboration will focus on Lecturer Exchange, Student Exchange, Joint Research, and International Conferences. This agreement provides for exchange opportunities for both researchers, lecturers, undergraduate and graduate students to promote academic and research cooperation in the fields of social and political sciences, with a focus on China-Indonesia relations.

FISIP and Research Center for China-Indonesia People to People Exchange, Central China Normal University agree to institute this programs under the following terms:

1. Scope of Collaboration

Each Party will, subject to the laws, rules, regulation and national policies from time to time in force, governing the subject matter in their respective countries, endeavor to take necessary steps to encourage and promote cooperation in the following areas:

- a) The exchange of academic staff;
- b) The exchange of students;
- c) The collaborative academic publications and researches;
- d) Collaboration in organizing seminars, conferences, symposiums, lectures and intellectual discourses;
- e) Collaborative workshops for community service and entrepreneurship programs; and
- f) Any others of cooperation to be mutually agreed upon between the Parties

2. Financial Arrangements

- a) This MoA shall not give rise to any financial obligation by one Party to the other.
- b) Each Party shall bear its own cost and expenses in the implementation of this MoA unless otherwise agreed upon in writing for specific collaborative projects.



3. Intellectual Property

- a) Any intellectual property created jointly as a result of the collaboration under this MoA shall be subject to separate written agreements between the Parties.
- b) Each Party shall retain ownership of its pre-existing intellectual property and contributions.

4. Duration

- a) This MoA will come into effect on the date of signing and will remain in force for a period of one (1) year.
- b) The termination of the MoA shall not affect the implementation of ongoing activities/programs.
- c) This MoA may be extended for a further period as may be agreed in writing by the Parties.
