Notification of any change in liaison officers may be made by letter.

AMENDMENTS, RENEWAL, AND TERMINATION

Thereafter it shall be automatically renewed each year; however, after the initial period either university may terminate the agreement by giving six months written notice of such intent.

The institutions undertake to balance the numbers of students from each institution over the term of the Agreement. With the agreement of the host institution the number of student exchanges in a particular year may exceed two where it is necessary to "balance" the numbers of exchange students.

3. Status of Exchange Students

Each institution shall normally accept incoming exchange students as non-degree students (i.e. students who do not aim at obtaining a degree or other formal qualification from the host university.)

4. Acceptance Procedures

The students participating in the exchange program under the terms of this Agreement shall be selected initially by the home institution, and the host institution shall make the final admission decision in each case. The following selection criteria will generally apply but may be varied in appropriate cases:

- Students will have completed at least one year of university work prior to participation in the exchange;
