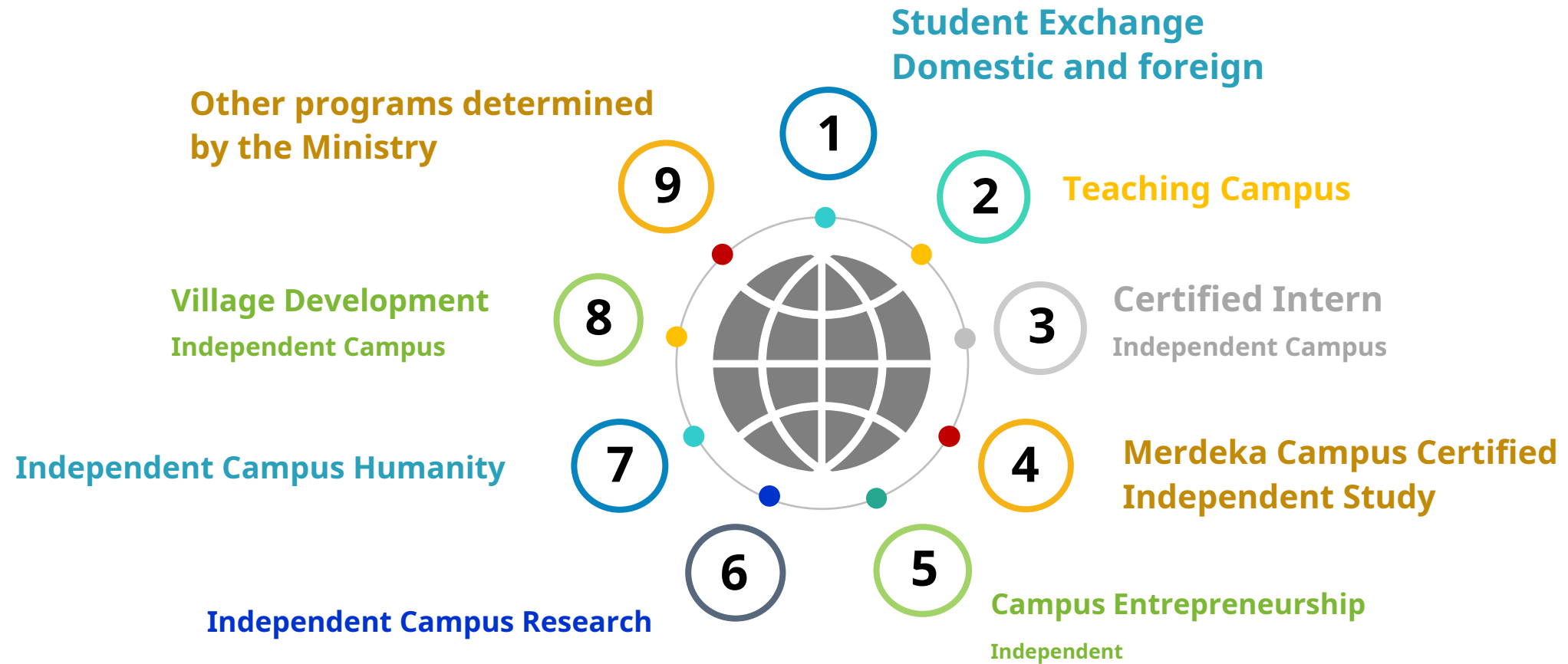

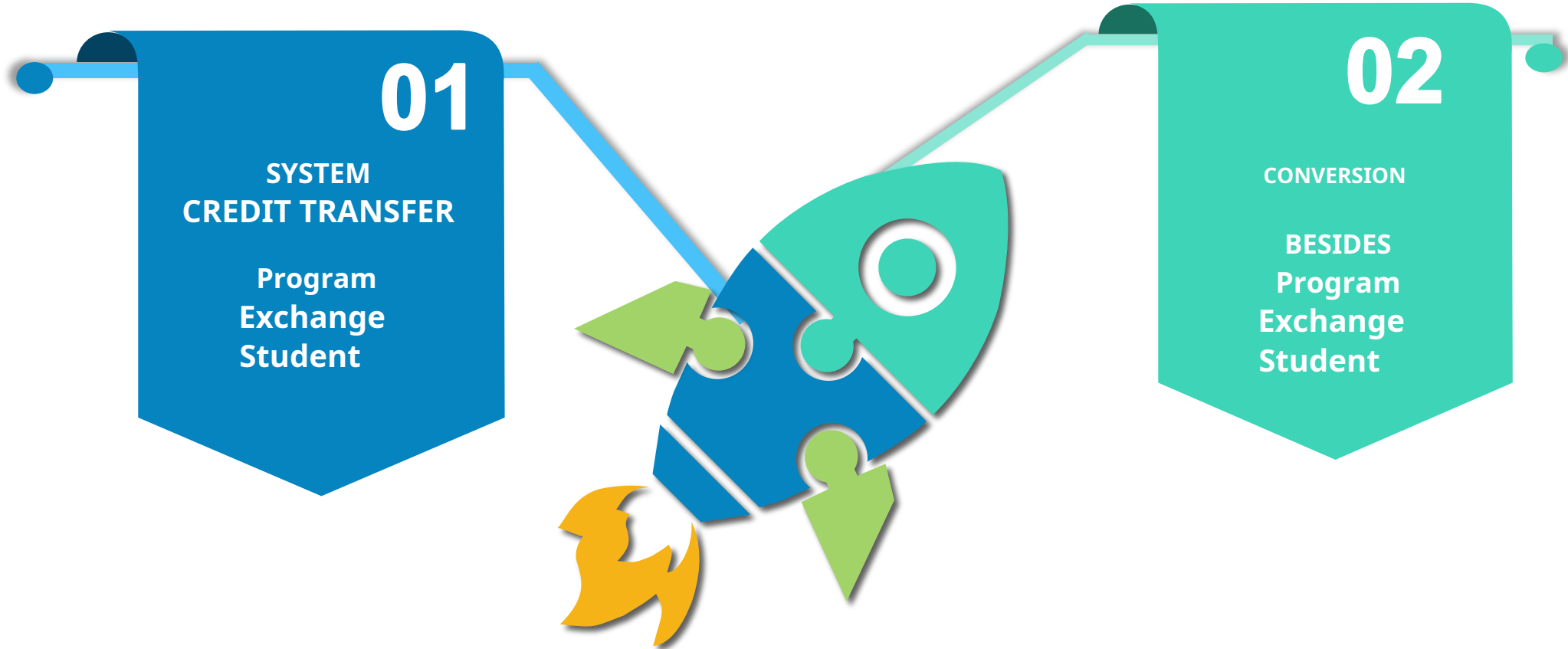


- a. Credit transfer system**

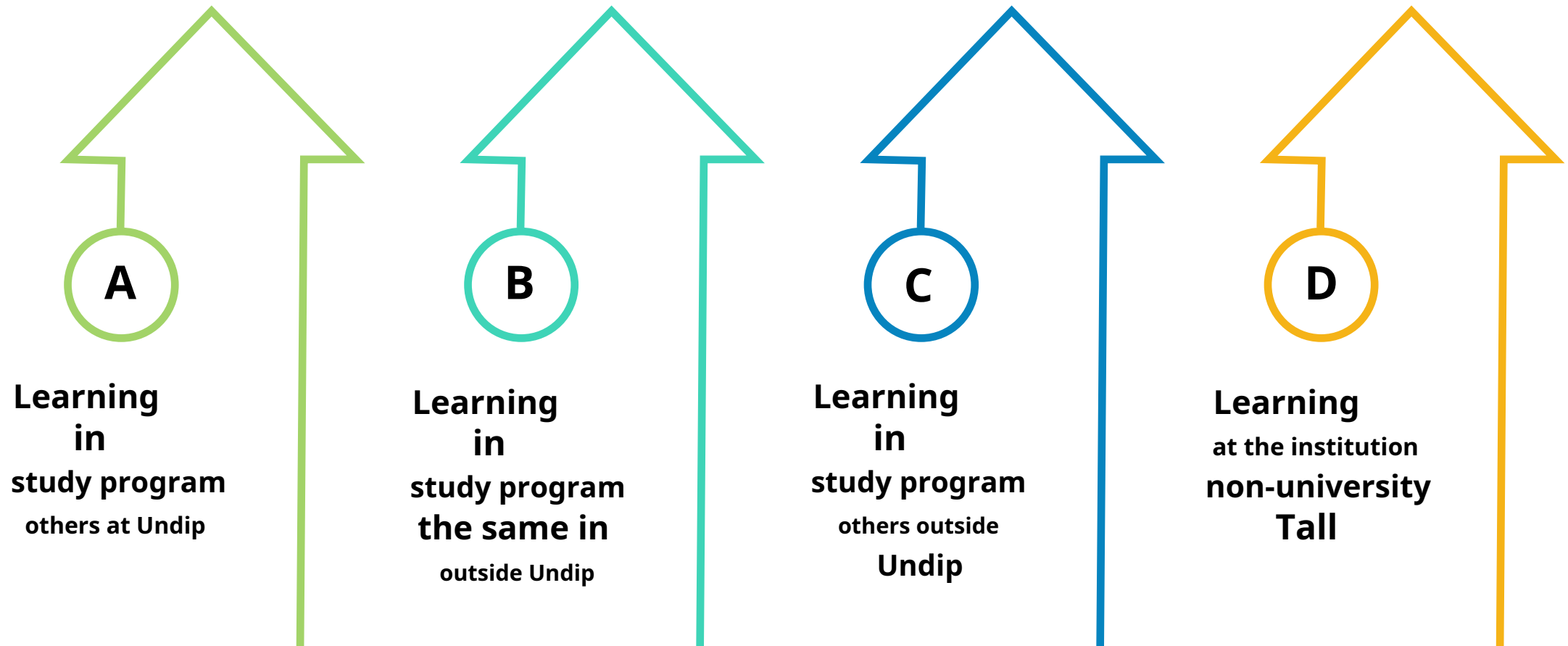

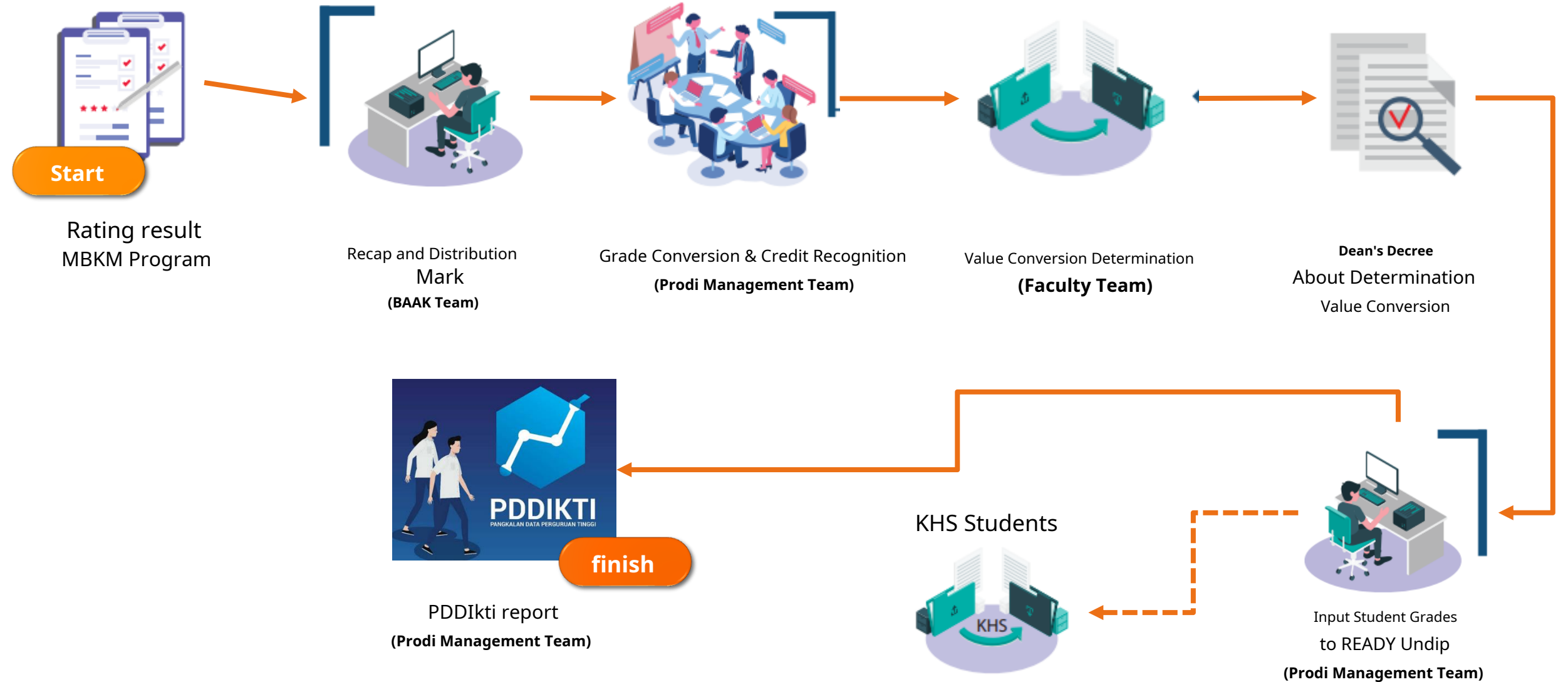

# Faculty Duties



- 01 create/arrange MBKM activity plans
- 02 regulate the quota of participants who take the courses offered in the form of learning in other study programs at different universities
- 03 developing partnership cooperation for MBKM activities through MoUs and Cooperation Agreements (PKS)
- 04 verify the MBKM activity plans submitted by students so that they can then be converted into courses in the study program
- 05 set *Letter of Acceptance* MBKM activities tailored to the courses to be converted
- 06 coordinating the conversion of course coding and scores resulting from MBKM activities into study program courses
- 07 make reports on proof of course attendance and/or implementation of activities that are adjusted to the academic information system that is integrated with the Undip database

01

have completed at least 100 credits of courses and other requirements

02

In certain cases the Chancellor can reduce the number of credits required

03

Students who meet the requirements can choose courses that can be taken outside Undip on the academic information system that is integrated with the Undip database

04

Students are still required to complete the mandatory science courses determined by the study program

**Undip can accept students participating in the MBKM program from other universities learning programs outside the study program**

01

**The study program at Undip can accept students from the MBKM program between study programs at Undip learning programs outside the study program**

02

**carried out on the basis of a cooperation agreement between Undip with program organizing partners MBKM**

03

**The study program at Undip can select prospective MBKM program participants**

04

**MBKM program learning is held based on the Undip academic calendar or schedule that has been jointly determined by Undip and partners MBKM program organizer**

# CONVERSION

01

**Course conversion is carried out by the Dean by forming a Study Program Conversion Team**

02

**The conversion team consists of:**

- a. Dean as Chair;**
- b. Deputy Dean for Academic and Student Affairs as Deputy Chair;**
- c. Head of Department as Member;**
- d. Head of Study Program as Member;**
- e. Head of Section as Member;**
- f. Chair of the Faculty Senate as Member; And**
- g. Course Teaching Lecturers and/or Supervising Lecturers as Members**

03

**The conversion team is determined by the Dean's Decree**

**04**

**Conversion Team Authority:**

- a. Convert MBKM activities into mandatory or elective courses in the form of credits and/or value;**
- b. provide an assessment of MBKM activities after being converted into courses;**
- c. request information and documents from all parties related to MBKM activities; And/ or**
- d. Evaluate MBKM activities**

**05**

**MBKM activities can be converted and recognized as credits for compulsory science courses and/or elective courses based on the decision of the study program Conversion Team**

**06**

**The Conversion Team's decision making is carried out by deliberation and consensus, but in the event that no agreement is reached, the decision is determined by the Dean**

**07**

**Course codes taken by Undip students outside the study program are converted into special codes in the academic information system which is integrated with the Undip database**

**08**

**Lecturers who teach courses or supervisors in MBKM program learning activities can provide grades and final evaluation results (full credit transfer) to students for recognition and conversion.**

**09**

**In the event that the course lecturer or supervisor in the MBKM program learning activities does not provide grades and final evaluation results (full credit transfer) to students, the assessment will be carried out by the Conversion Team.**

**10**

**Conversion pays attention to learning outcomes consisting of hard skills and/or soft skills relevant to the study material and/or course, with calculations:**

- a. Study of more than 16 weeks or 560 cumulative hours up to 24 weeks or 840 cumulative hours is given recognition equivalent to 20 credits**
- b. Learning for more than 24 weeks or 840 cumulative hours up to less than 40 weeks or 1400 cumulative hours, additional credit recognition of 1 credit for every additional 1 week or 35 cumulative hours is given**
- c. Learning between 40 weeks or 1400 cumulative hours to weeks or 1680 cumulative hours is given recognition equivalent to 40 credits**

**Conversion can also be done through recognition of student achievements into MBKM activities in competitions organized by national and international institutions or organizations recognized by the government and/or Undip**

**12**

**Conversion of course grades is determined in the Dean's Decree by considering the decision of the Conversion Team**

**13**

- Elective courses consist of:**
- a. Study program elective courses**
  - b. Special MBKM courses include:**
    - 1. Entrepreneurial practice;**
    - 2. Social communication;**
    - 3. Humanitarianism;**
    - 4. Intercultural social interaction;**
    - 5. Service in the village;**
    - 6. Innovation projects;**
    - 7. Internships;**
    - 8. Problem solving; And**
    - 9. Archipelago module.**

**The quota for each study program is a maximum of 10% of the total capacity of courses held per class or according to the availability of class capacity quotas**

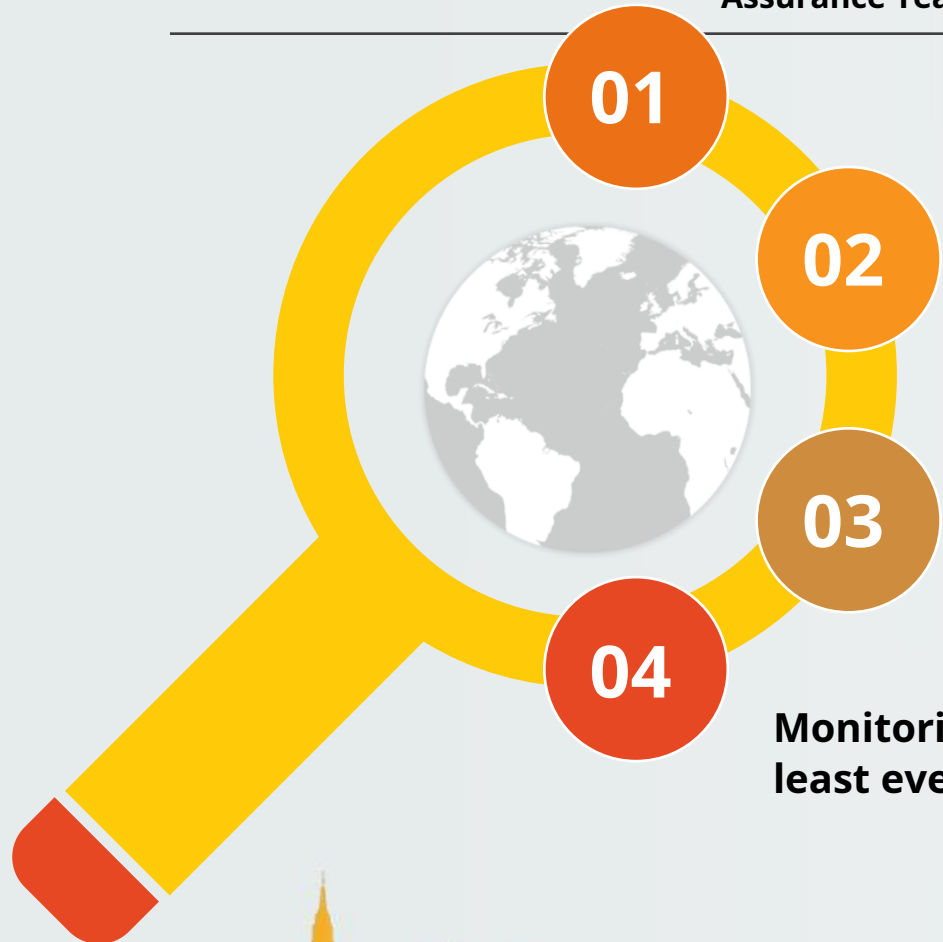

# Quality Assurance Monitoring and Evaluation

Quality Assurance for the MBKM program is carried out by the Faculty Quality Assurance Team (TPMF) and the Quality Assurance Group (GPM)



Quality Assurance includes:

- a. Planning the learning process and/or other activities;
- b. Teaching and learning processes and/or other activities;
- c. Teaching and learning assessment process and/or other activities.

The monitoring and evaluation process is coordinated by LP2MP

Monitoring and evaluation is carried out periodically at least every 6 (six) months

# Cost

The costs of implementing the MBKM program which is a program of the Ministry or other parties are financed by Ministry or other parties

Undip students who take part in MBKM activities outside or within Undip pay UKT according to applicable regulations

The costs of implementing the MBKM program, which is a program outside the program of the Ministry or other parties, are paid by the MBKM program participants

The Chancellor sets cost standards for implementing the MBKM program

The Chancellor determines the service rates for the MBKM program

For MBKM program participants who take part in activities based on a cooperation agreement, it depends on the clauses stated in the cooperation agreement
